Off. Lund Begins the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program

On January 17, 2012 Officer Brandon Lund began the 22nd Basic law Enforcement Training Program at the Maine Criminal Justice Academy in Vassalboro. This begins his 18 weeks of intensive training in all aspects of police work. Prior to being accepted Brandon had to complete personal, professional and criminal background checks, a polygraph examination, a psychological examination, medical exams and physical agility testing. Cadet Lund and the others are currently studying criminal, motor vehicle and civil law. They are being tested on strength and endurance functioning with little rest. They will spend numerous hours on the firearms range and learning emergency vehicle operations.

Additional Officers Receive and Attend Training

With each new academy class I am contacted by Director John Rogers and asked to supply officers to assist them in their training needs. While we always try and send an officer or two for the academy practical week, I also receive requests for particular officers with individualized training. Recently Officer Fleming instructed motor vehicle stops and Lieutenant Tuminaro instructed Crisis Conflict Management. I believe this speaks to the excellent training and professionalism of the members of the Winslow Police Department. Also this month School Resource Officer McGowen received instructor training for the Boomerang program. Boomerang is an alternative to the court system for juveniles who have been charged with first time drug and alcohol offenses. The students learn about the dangers of substance abuse and the consequences of choices they make. SRO McGowen and Officer Lefferts also attended the Reid Technique of Interviewing and Interrogating. This 4 day class was again sponsored by the Winslow Police Department and officers from throughout Maine attended this very worthwhile training.

Mock Lock Down Conducted at Winslow Junior High School

Recently SRO McGowen and I along with school administrators conducted a lock down drill at the junior high. Students and staff did

an excellent job throughout the entire process. The Standard Response Protocol is being utilized nationally and is based on the concept of the "I Love You Guys" foundation whose name was taken from the last words John-Michael Keyes heard from his 16 year old daughter Emily before a gunman took her life at Platte County High School. We recently conducted the training at the elementary school and next month I will assist him at the high school.
